Communicable Disease

The Communicable Disease program investigates communicable diseases and conducts disease surveillance to prevent and control outbreaks. The program also provides tuberculosis case management for immigrants with Class B1 and B2 status.

Emergency Preparedness

The Emergency Preparedness program coordinates public health education, planning, preparation, response and recovery to disease outbreaks, natural and man-made disasters, and other threats to the health and safety of the community.

Safe Kids Sarpy/Cass

Safe Kids Sarpy/Cass coordinates efforts to reduce unintentional injuries and death in children 19 years and under by providing resources, educational information, and presentations to the public on childhood injury prevention.

Health Education

The Health Education program aims to enhance knowledge, attitudes, and skills to positively influence health behaviors of residents through education and programming.

Minority Health

The Minority Health program strives to understand and address the unique needs of all populations in our community, connecting residents to resources and appropriate programming.

Breastfeeding Support

The Breastfeeding Support program supports mothers and families enrolled in the Nebraska WIC program through peer-to-peer breastfeeding education and referrals to breastfeeding resources.

Environmental Health

The Environmental Health program controls environmental hazards and preserves and improves environmental factors for the achievement of optimum health, safety, comfort, and well-being.
